




The workshop will take place in Amsterdam on the 30th of June and the 1st of July 2022.

New SRN Chairperson



Margaret McVeigh PhD is Head, Screenwriting & Contextual Studies, Griffith Film School, Griffith University, Australia. She holds a Masters of Screenwriting by Creative Practice and a PhD in Film and New Media Narrative. Margaret is 2021-2022 Chair of the Screenwriting Research Network.

As Chairperson, what are your main goals for the current term of the Executive Council?

I went to my first SRN Conference in Madison, Wisconsin in 2013. I was in awe of everything – the vision of those who set up the network, the knowledge and passion of the speakers, the beauty and deep history of the venue, and most of all the welcome and friendship that was

afforded to me. My goal is to give back to all those who have given to me so freely over the years - to continue to build this special worldwide community of scholars who are united in their love for, and generosity in, sharing the new knowledge that makes our field so rich and exciting. As Chairperson I want to remember the awe of that first conference, to build on and share what I have learnt so that each person who comes to the SRN for the first time knows they have found their tribe.

What do you see as the future of screenwriting research, and what role will the SRN play in this?

There are so many avenues to screenwriting research - screenwriting as creative practice, the hybrid nature of screen studies as it informs screenwriting and vice versa, the publishing of a screenplay as a creative output, the broadening of our work into languages other than English, screenwriting for new technologies - I look forward to seeing the development of these and the many other areas we all write about. My personal research passions are creativity and screenwriting, and screenwriting for transnational film and TV productions. That is what I will be doing. But the SRN is everybody, not just one person or the executive. As scholars in a still emerging area of research, it is up to each and everyone one of us to make that future.

SRN 2022 in Vienna is coming up... What are you looking forward to the most about this year's annual conference?

The SRN conference is something I really look forward to every year. I can't wait to see all my friends again, and as Rose would say to meet the friends "I have not yet met". I have a special interest in Global Storytelling having co-edited with Carmen Sofia Brenes and Patrick Cattryse the book, *Transcultural Screenwriting*: *Telling Stories for a Global World*, so I am really looking forward to the keynotes who will be sharing with us their deep knowledge in the area.
