An Interview

with the organisers of the Vienna Conference

**Why did you choose the topic "Globalizing Screenwriting" for this year's conference?
Why do you feel this topic is important today?**

Migration into and from Europe has had an enormous effect on film production, both historically speaking and even more so in recent times. The specific mixture of storytelling modes in diasporic cinema, or what Hamid Naficy calls "accented cinema" is a major point of investigation for screenwriting studies, especially because he re-values the role of the author. But migration has also influenced and shaped mainstream cinema, historically as well as recently.

Vienna has always been a crystallizing point of different and opposing tendencies in aesthetics and politics. It therefore seems to be the ideal place to discuss topics like transnational storytelling, transcultural transfer, universalism vs. essentialism, or strategies of de-colonization within the field of screenwriting. Screenwriting (and, by extension, filmmaking) is one way of making sense of the world we live in.

The response to our Call for Papers demonstrates that these topics are able to attract screenwriting scholars from around the globe. Choosing topics like this also helps the Screenwriting Research Network to reach out beyond its already international membership. The result should be a conference with a broad diversity of voices, but also a critical approach to and revision of the "doxa" of screenwriting research.

2. What aspect or event of the conference are you looking forward to the most?

We were able to get two fantastic keynote speakers for the conference, Prof. Dina Iordanova and Prof. Eleftheria Thanouli, whose lectures will be absolute highlights. Both scholars have not worked on screenwriting so far. It is the aim of the conference to deliver fresh and innovative insights and motivations from outside the field.

This conference is the first to be held in person since Porto 2019 and having the opportunity to meet old and new friends and colleagues after such a long time will be a great experience. That being said, we are mostly looking forward to the coffee breaks, the conference dinner and the town hall reception.



3. Any special recommendations for all the SRN members who will be travelling to Vienna in a couple of weeks?

Take a leisurely stroll through the city and discover the hidden side streets of the inner districts. The flair of Vienna can also be captured very well in one of the typical cafes, with Melange and apple strudel. A visit to the Heurigen is a must, our conference dinner takes place at one of the most beautiful in the city, there is no better way to experience Vienna.

And here are some specific recommendations for all film lovers:

- If you are a fan of horror and fantasy films, visit **the Slash film festival**.
- The **Film Archive Austria** is screening Swiss films at the time of the conference.
- The **Film Museum** is currently showing retrospectives of Márta Mészáros and Martin Scorsese.
