

<u>Jeff Melvoin: Running the Show: Television from the Inside,</u> <u>Applause 2023.</u>

Keynote Speaker at the SRN Conference 2023 **Jeff Melvoin**, showrunner and writer of such shows as Northern Exposure, Army Wives, Killing Eve has a new book coming out on September 1st. If you purchase it before traveling to SRN2023 Jeff can sign it after his Keynote speech. More info here:

Running the Show takes you inside building a show from the ground up and what a showrunner's life looks like in Hollywood. This unique job covers aspects from the creative to the managerial and everything in between. Seasoned showrunner Jeffrey Melvoin shares his fascinating insider's perspective on how to call the shots and make the final decisions when choosing and writing scripts, hiring staff, casting, making the budget, and juggling schedules. Along with the managerial responsibilities that keep the show afloat, the book also describes the visionary aspects of planning a series and characters. Melvoin describes how to confidently communicate abstract ideas so they can become the show's reality.

Running the Show reveals the ethical side of show running and writing with humor, integrity, and wisdom.




<u>Pablo Castrillo Maortua: History and Story in the American</u> <u>Political Thriller Film: Hollywood in the Labyrinth</u>

Analysis of the emergence of the political thriller in Hollywood at a time of angst and turmoil in the United States. The Cold War, the nuclear age, domestic and international scandals, and an increasingly deceitful political culture catalyzed a filmmaking current that would gradually develop its own narrative form and aesthetics into a new genre. Castrillo Maortua explores the dramatic identity and design of the American political thriller, tracking the close correlation between the evolution of the genre and the history of the United States from the Cuban Missile Crisis to the 9/11 terrorist attacks and the ensuing War on Terror. Ultimately, the author demonstrates how the American political defies Hollywood conventions presuppositions with an entertaining yet critical view of the state of politics. Scholars of film studies, screenwriting, and genre theory will find this book of particular interest.



<u>Christine Lang: David Lynchs »Mulholland Drive« verstehen – Visuelles Erzählen und die Dramaturgie der offenen Form,</u> Bielefeld 2023.



German-language book

"Mulholland Drive" (2001) by David Lynch is a film classic and a piece of pop culture. Its attraction is based above all on the openended and "puzzling" narrative style, which invites viewers to interpret it. In a detailed study, Christine Lang explains how this relationship of reception is realised. She analyses the narrative structure and the aesthetic strategies with methods and concepts of dramaturgy and thus makes the film and its advanced narrative method comprehensible in terms of content.



Monika Bednarek: Language and Characterisation in Television Series. Amsterdam/Philadelphia: John Benjamins 2023.

This book explores how language is used to create characters in fictional television series. To do so, it draws on multiple case studies from the United States and Australia. Brought together in this book for the first time, these case studies constitute more than the sum of their parts. They highlight different aspects of televisual characterisation and showcase the use of different data, methods, and approaches in its analysis.
